Colonel Culbert served as a Tactical Control Officer, Platoon Leader, and Motor Maintenance Officer at two Air Defense Firing Batteries in Germany; Commander, F Battery, Student Battalion, US Air Defense School; Chief of Collective Training and Development Branches, US Air Defense School; Director of Policy and Governance for the Army Chief of Information Operations; Army Knowledge Management Project Officer: Liaison for Reserve Component and Homeland Security Task Force; Program Manager for the Strategic Project Office, US Army Reserve, Chief Information Officer, Army Reserve Y2K Project Manager, Deputy Commander, 5035th Garrison Support Unit, Fort Bliss, TX. He also served as the Director of Information Operations in the Office of the Chief of the Army Reserve, Washington, DC.
