Colonel Granger is a graduate of the US Army Field Artillery Officer Basic and Advanced Courses, the Armor Advanced Course, and the Naval College of Command and Staff. He holds a Master of National Security and Strategic Studies from the Naval War College, Newport, RI.

In 1988, upon graduation from Northwestern State University, Colonel Granger was commissioned into the Field Artillery. He served in a variety of command and staff positions in the 3rd Infantry Division, 17th and 212th Field Artillery Brigades, III (US) Corps, III (US) Corps Artillery, US Army Europe, and the 7th Army (Joint Maneuver Readiness Center).

Colonel Granger completed two combat tours in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom. In 2004, he served as Targeting Officer and Executive Officer for the Multi-National Corps-Iraq, Effects Coordination Cell. In 2005, as Commander of the 1st Battalion, 12th Field Artillery, deployed to OIP 05-07 (Baghdad). His last assignment was the Director of Strategic Communications to the Commanding General, US Army Fires Center of Excellence and Fort Sill.

Upon completion of the Advanced Arts and Studies Fellowship in 2009, Colonel Granger took command of the 5th Battlefield Coordination Detachment in Hawaii.

His significant awards include the Legion of Merit, the Bronze Star with one Oak leaf Cluster, the Meritorious Service Medal with four Oak Leaf Clusters, the Army Commendation Medal with two Oak Leaf Clusters, the Army Achievement Medal with five Oak Leaf Clusters, and the Combat Action Badge.

Colonel Granger is married to the former Rachel Heider. They have one son, Zachary, and one daughter, Abigail.
