

## BRIGADIER GENERAL CURTIS F. HOGLAN US Army, Retired

Brigadier General Curtis Hoglan was born in Austin, TX. He graduated from Northwestern State College with a Bachelor of Education in 1955 and commissioned as an Artillery officer.

His assignments include Platoon Leader, Anti-Aircraft Artillery, Fort Lewis, WA, and Fort Richardson, AK; multiple battery commands in 1<sup>st</sup> Battalion, 80<sup>th</sup> Field Artillery, Fort Sill, OK, and the 4<sup>th</sup> Missile Battalion, 61<sup>st</sup> Air Defense Artillery at Robins Air Force Base, GA; G-3 (Plans) Officer, 8<sup>th</sup> US Army, Korea; Instructor, US Army Infantry School, Fort Benning GA; Executive Officer, 8<sup>th</sup> Battalion, 4<sup>th</sup> Field Artillery in Vietnam.

From 1969-1972, he served with the Office of the Assistant Chief of Staff, Intelligence, Headquarters, Department of the Army. Additional assignments included 2<sup>nd</sup> Battalion, 10<sup>th</sup> Field Artillery, Fort Benning, GA; 72<sup>nd</sup> Field Artillery Brigade and the Wertheim Military Community, Wertheim, GE; Plans Officer, Blue Eagles, Office of the Chief of Legislative Liaison, Headquarters, Department of the Army; Commander, CINPAC Airborne Command Post, HI; Commanding General, V Corps Artillery, Frankfurt, GE; and Commanding General, First ROTC Region, Fort Bragg, NC, where he served until his retirement from active duty on 1 August 1985.

Brigadier General Hoglan is a graduate of the Anti-Aircraft Artillery Basic Course, the Field Artillery Battery Officer's Course, the Field Artillery Officer's Advanced Course, the Infantry Officer's Advanced Course, the Command and General Staff College, and the US Army War College. General Hoglan earned a Master of Public Administration from Shippensburg University, Pennsylvania.

His decorations and awards include the Distinguished Service Medal, two Bronze Stars, Purple Heart, Defense Meritorious Service Medal, Meritorious Service Medal, Air Medal, Army Commendation Medal, National Defense Service Medal, Vietnam Campaign Medal, Vietnam Cross of Gallantry with Palm, Aircraft Crewman Badge, Army General Staff Identification Badge, and the Jungle Expert Badge.

Brigadier General Hoglan and his wife, Katherine, have two children: a daughter, Sonja, and son, Steve.
